### Things you need to know

- ❖ There is no off-street parking in front of the museum. Access must be maintained for emergency vehicles and residents. Please follow parking attendant's directions.
- ❖ Parking is available kerbside on Comur and Browne Streets as well as Woolworths carpark.
- ❖ Please be courteous to our volunteers and each other.

### **TERMS & CONDITIONS OF THE AUCTION**

- 1) Any persons attending the auction site before, during and after the auction do so at their own risk.
- 2) Items may be withdrawn from sale prior to the auction.
- 3) Bidders must be registered prior to commencement of the sale and acknowledge and accept the terms and conditions herein. The Auctioneer reserves the right to refuse registration of any intended bidder for any reason.
- 4) In the event of a disputed bid the auctioneer is the sole arbitrator, and his decision will be final.
- 5) The items auctioned are sold as is and available for inspection on Friday 17 November between 11am and 2pm and between 5pm and 7pm and from 9am on Saturday 28 October.
- 6) It is the buyer's responsibility to check and inspect all items prior to purchase. No responsibility will be taken for inaccurate listing of goods.
- 7) Lots may be damaged, incomplete, or not in working order.
- 8) Electrical items should be inspected by a licensed electrician before use.
- 9) The goods sold are exclusive of GST.
- 10) There is no buyer's premium on items purchased.
- 11) Payments are to be made in cash or by eftpos after the sale.
- 12) Goods are not to be removed until such time as payment in full has been made and the receipt produced at the time of collection.
- 13) Buyers must organise packaging and cartage of their purchased items, on the day of the sale. Cartage of large items, after the day of the sale, are to be negotiated between the buyer and the vendor.
- 14) The buyer is wholly responsible for any damage to property, or injury to persons, which may occur during the removal or handling of any property purchased.

## ***Answers to questions you may have about our auction***

### **Why are you selling the museum items?**

We must relocate our archival collection to the museum building before June 2024. This is only possible if we remove objects that do not meet the criteria set out in our Collections Policy.

### **Who are the auctioneers?**

Individual auctioneers have volunteered their services to assist the society with the sale.

### **Is there a catalogue?**

There will not be a definitive catalogue but an overview of the items being offered for sale will be posted online shortly.

### **Can the auction items be viewed before the sale?**

Items can be inspected on Friday 17 November between 11am and 2pm and between 5pm and 7pm. On sale day (Saturday 18 November) from 9am until the sale commences at 11am.

### **When can I register as a bidder?**

Registrations are accepted on Friday during viewing times and anytime on Saturday.

### **Is there online bidding?**

No. We are unable to offer that facility for a one-off auction.

### **Is there a buyer's premium?**

No. The last bid is the price to be paid.

### **What payment facilities are available at the auction?**

On auction day Eftpos and cash will be accepted but cheques will not.

### **Do you supply packing materials for the items sold.**

Some lots are boxed but without packing. It is your responsibility to ensure that purchased items are securely packed. Please bring your own boxes, bags and packing.

### **Will food and drinks be available at the auction?**

Yass Public School P & C Association will provide cool drinks, tea, and coffee from 9.30am with BBQ food available from 10.30am to 2pm. Please note that no food or drinks can be brought into the building.

### **Is there parking available?**

There is no off-street parking in front of the museum. Access must be always maintained for emergency and residents' vehicles. Parking is available kerbside on Comur and Browne Streets as well as Woolworths carpark.

### **Are there toilet facilities?**

The nearest toilet facilities are in Coronation Park, two doors down from the museum.
